



**Workhouse Arts Center
General Class & Camp Covid Policies (Fall 2021 & Winter 2022)***

**Please note individual program(s) classes and all camps may carry their own set of additional policies and procedures and are subject to change.*

- All staff and instructors will be required to be fully vaccinated (as the term “fully vaccinated” is defined by the CDC) by October 1, 2021, and will be required to submit to the Workhouse’s President/CEO proof of vaccination. IF a staff member, or a contractor, chooses not be vaccinated, then that staff member, or contractor, will be required to submit to the Workhouse’s President/CEO weekly proof of a negative COVID test.
- Workhouse Arts Foundation, Inc. (WAF), strongly recommends that all other Workhouse colleagues, i.e., artists, volunteers, students and guests, also become fully vaccinated, or submit to weekly COVID testing in order to assure that these colleagues remain COVID free. The cost for these COVID tests will be the responsibility of those individuals.
- Students and campers of all ages, including Instructors, counselors, artists and staff are required to wear a face covering/mask upon entry to any campus building and for the duration of class.
- Class sizes are limited to a maximum of no more than 12-18 people in one classroom at a time (including the instructor) and will vary depending on space size.
- Instructional methods have been adopted to strictly follow, allow and provide for social distancing between instructors and class participants. I.e. the 6-foot rule.
- Workhouse programs will cooperate with instructors/students in the cleaning and sanitization of classroom and work space facilities to including cleaning of all surfaces after each class, as well as regularly cleaning. Disinfectant is provided and accessible for use in classrooms/building.
- Any student(s), campers, artist(s) or instructors feeling ill should not attend class.
- Any student who may have had close contact within the past three weeks with someone who they know has symptoms of COVID-19 and has not tested negative for COVID-19 after the onset of symptoms, should not attend class.
- Any Student who becomes ill while in our classroom buildings should leave immediately and notify Workhouse immediately as to their condition so that WAF can take appropriate precautions for other artists, staff, students and instructors.
- Students should perform 20 sec. handwashing before (as you enter buildings), during and after their classes.
- Hand sanitation stations are provided at student entry points to buildings.
- We will continue to minimize the sharing of any tool(s) when feasible and request that Instructors provide a supply list to their students when feasible, so students can bring their own set of art supplies to each class (if applicable).
- We require the thorough cleaning of any equipment contact areas and shared tools upon finishing the use of that piece of equipment or shared tool.
